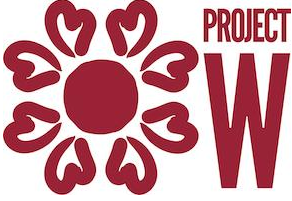

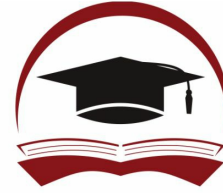


Thank you to **Project W** for their recent generous outreach donations totaling \$4,025 to help with critical needs for our clients in Delaware County!
